- Governor Abbott's closure order was extended to the end of the 2019-20 school year. Please do not send updates on districts closings to disasterinfo@tea.texas.gov.
- The TEA COVID-19 Superintendent Call have moved to Tuesday and Thursday at 3:00pm. The call-in information has changed. Please use the call-in information sent via TEA's Superintendent Listserv on May 5, 2020.

Recap of topics covered:

- Closure Order
 - Governor Abbott, on Friday, April 17, issued Executive Order-16 that closes schools through the 2019-2020 school year
- Governor Abbott's Strike Force to Open Texas
 - TEA is working with educators, medical experts, and other officials to provide recommendations related to re-opening education.
 - Thank you to those districts across the state that supported this guidance development as part of the graduation working group!
 - Governor Abbott's Executive Order-21, issued on Tuesday, May 5, announced three key changes to cover graduation ceremonies, students accessing schools, and staff accessing schools.
 - Graduation and Promotion Ceremonies
 - A guidance document related to <u>Graduation and End-of-Year Promotion</u> <u>Ceremonies</u> includes information on the requirements and the three ceremony scenarios that are allowed under the current public safety environment.
 - This guidance document can also be found in the <u>Graduation 2020</u> section of our website.
 - Students Accessing Schools
 - An additional <u>guidance</u> document was posted for students accessing the school building for administrative or non-instructional purposes
 - Graduating seniors may also go back for activities that cannot be done virtually
 - For clarification, the <u>Special Education FAQ</u> was updated to note that inperson evaluations are still not allowed.



- Staff Accessing Schools
 - Given that the official COVID symptoms list has been expanded by the CDC, the <u>protocols for staff accessibility</u> to schools was updated to include new health and safety protocols.
- TEA will not be able to answer individual scenario questions, but we encourage you to thoroughly read the guidance and use your judgement. If anything is unclear, please email <u>disasterinfo@tea.texas.gov</u> and we can clarify on in future superintendent calls.
- Health Care System Coordination
 - An additional <u>FAQ</u> was created to provide information on frontline child care.
 - If you haven't seen it already, check out the website devoted to frontline child care: https://frontlinechildcare.texas.gov/
- Child Nutrition
 - Friday, May 1 was School Lunch Hero Day is a nationwide celebration to showcase the difference school nutrition professional make in the lives of children.
- Graduation 2020
 - For seniors graduating this year, several new <u>FAQs</u> were posted, including information related to <u>Individual Graduation Committees</u>.
 - The NCAA posted an https://tea.texas.gov/sites/default/files/ncaa_faq.pdfFAQ for student-athletes and eligibility.
- Instructional Materials
 - The instructional materials inventory requirement is now waived, as described in the <u>Instructional Materials Guidance</u> document.
 - Also posted were the <u>steps</u> to submit the instructional materials inventory waiver.
- Educator Certification and Preparation
 - Several updates to the Guidance on Educator Certification and Preparation FAQ were posted.
 - Governor Abbott issued waivers allowing those candidates completing student teaching or an internship this spring to receive a one-year, probationary certificate for the 2020-21 school year without taking certification exams if they have met all other certification requirements.
 - <u>Instructions for teacher candidates</u> applying for a probationary certificate were posted.
 - For Educator Preparation Programs, <u>instructions</u> were posted for recommending a probationary certificate for a teacher candidate.
- Attendance and Enrollment
 - A clarification on the sixth-six weeks reporting period related to the 2019-2020 PEIMS Summer Submission was included in an updated <u>Attendance and Enrollment FAQ</u>.
- Uncontactable &/or Disengaged Students
 - A new FAQ and Best Practices guidance was posted related to supporting districts with identifying <u>Uncontactable Students</u>.
 - Related to this Uncontactable FAQ, a <u>Crisis Codes Reporting Guidance</u> document was posted to inform policy makers and support best practice around

- identifying these students, particularly as they move from one district to another.
- It is important to note that this information will not be used for any accountability purposes.
- Student Discipline
 - o The Student Discipline FAQ was updated with several new responses.
- ASVAB Reporting
 - An <u>FAQ</u> was posted related to the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) exam.
 - Additionally, a document that outlines the <u>steps</u> to submit an ASVAB waiver was posted on Tuesday.
- Summary of Waivers
 - The <u>COVID-19 Related Waivers</u> summary document was updated to include the Instructional Materials Inventory and ASVAB waiver.
- Funding
 - An updated <u>Federal Funding and Grants FAQ</u> was posted to include several new responses, including a new section on Migrant Students.
 - The General State Funding FAQ was also updated.
 - In collaboration with the Texas Department of Emergency Management (TDEM) and FEMA, the <u>FEMA-related</u> issues FAQ was updated to include clarity around allowable expenses.
 - A conference call hosted by FEMA and TDEM took place last Friday; the webinar recording and fact sheet will be posted the week of May 4.
 - An optional COVID Detailed Cost Survey was sent to superintendents on Tuesday 5/5 asking for current costs and projected costs over next 6 months in 9 areas of potential additive costs.
 - The survey also includes sections on expected reimbursements from other fund sources and decreases in revenue.
 - Data from the survey will be used to coordinate implementation of various sources of funds in an attempt to reimburse LEAs for COVID-19 costs to the greatest extent possible.
 - We'd like at least 50 districts, with several districts in each major size band, to respond.
 - The survey is due at 11:59 p.m., Friday, May 8
- Certain Student Populations
 - Migrant Students
 - Guidance for implementing the Title I, Part C <u>Migrant Student Program</u> was posted to support districts with completing the certificate of eligibility.
 - English Learners
 - The <u>English Learner FAQ</u> was updated with new information for TELPAS administration.
- Assessment
 - An Optional End of Year Assessment for districts to diagnose student learning was announced last week with an FAQ.

- For districts interested in participating in the Optional End of Year Assessment, a <u>webinar</u> and <u>PPT</u> were posted with additional information.
- The Optional End of Year Assessment will be available to districts on May 11, if not sooner.
- Watch this video first to learn how to register a student data file.

- Several new resources have been added to the newly revamped and standalone Special Education <u>webpage</u>.
- The Special Education <u>FAQ</u> was updated to on Thursday to clarify the change to the SHARS parental consent and annual notice.
- The COVID-19 Special Education website now includes sections on <u>General Guidance</u>, <u>Instructional Supports</u>, and <u>Parent Resources</u>.
 - There are many new Instructional Support & Parent Support resources.
 - On Tuesday, a new <u>Tips for Remote Learning for Students who are Deaf/Hard of Hearing</u> guidance document was posted to support districts.
- Instructional Continuity and Texas Home Learning
 - Our Instructional Continuity <u>website</u> is updated daily with an FAQ, LOTS of resources, recording webinars, and much more. All optional.
 - <u>Detailed guidance</u> related to supporting at home learning for students with disabilities is now included within our Instructional Continuity planning resources.
 - An educator resource guidance related to the PBS At-Home Learning Collaboration is now also in <u>Spanish</u>!
 - o Regarding Texas Home Learning:
 - An overview of Phase 2.0 was posted as a preview to districts.
 - An update to the <u>printing and shipping process</u> was posted last Thursday. Districts can start placing printing and shipping orders now.
 - Spanish <u>packets</u> are now available!
 - ESCs can now support printing and shipping to districts.
 - TEA has also launched a Featured Resources section
