Reminders:

- <u>Governor Abbott's closure order</u> was extended to May 4, 2020. Please do not send updates on districts closings to <u>disasterinfo@tea.texas.gov</u>.
- TEA hosted an Instructional Continuity Informational Webinar Series every day this past week. You can find recordings on our <u>Instructional Continuity website</u>.
- Starting next week, the TEA COVID-19 Superintendent Call moves to Tuesday and Thursday at 3:00pm. Call-in information will remain the same.

Current status of facts:

• DSHS maintains a real-time dashboard of confirmed cases.

Recap of topics covered:

- All schools have been ordered closed up to, but excluding, May 4.
  - The <u>Guidance on Educator and Staff Issues</u> provides additional information on the closure order as well as clarifies who is considered essential personnel.
  - A <u>template</u> was created for staff authorizing their ability to commute to school while the shelter-in-place order is in place.
  - Parents are allowed to travel to schools to pick up meals, instructional packets, laptops or other devices, etc.
  - <u>Sample communications examples</u> have been provided to help in the event you need to communicate with staff/students about an infected staff or student.
- Public health communications campaign <u>Stay Well, Texas</u>
  - TEA, in collaboration with DSHS, has created <u>several resources for us to</u> <u>collectively execute a public health campaign</u>, including a campaign document, English and Spanish templates for social media posts and text messages for districts to send to their communities. Please help us by participating in the campaign.
- Health Care System Coordination
  - Child Care licensing waivers are coming soon. Information on current child care licensing requirements can be found <u>here</u>. Thank you for those districts that have launched child care sites for first responders and essential personnel.
- Food Service

- <u>TXschools.gov</u> is now hosting MealFinder to help families locate where to find breakfast and lunch for children. Thank you for your support in getting the word out.
- TDA is rapidly updating guidance on supporting meal service. Additional flexibility has been provided by USDA and TDA has implemented that flexibility. See the <u>Child Nutrition section of the TEA coronavirus page</u>
- Rural districts can take advantage of a <u>TDA meal delivery service</u>. More information is at <u>mealstoyou.org</u>
- School Finance While Closed
  - School finance provisions will apply the rest of this school year as long as districts are providing instruction to students. See the <u>Waivers & Funding</u> <u>section</u> of the coronavirus website, for information on:

    - FIRST ratings FAQ
    - Grant funding guidance
  - Be sure to <u>document every new cost</u> you have related to COVID-19! Without documentation, reimbursement is far less likely.
- School Boards
  - Additional guidance on required trainings and deadline extensions were included in the updated <u>School Board FAQs</u>.
- SPED
  - Several new SPED resources have been added on the new Special Education and Special Populations Coronavirus <u>webpage</u>. Additional resources include information related to ARD committees, Section 504, and evaluation and FERPA considerations.
  - Thank you to districts serving on the SPED Task Force!
- Certain Student Populations
  - Several new resources have been added on the new Special Education and Special Populations Coronavirus <u>webpage</u>. Guidance related to foster care and military connected students, in addition to information for students experiencing homelessness has been posted.
  - Updated <u>English Learner FAQs</u> posted on Thursday, including <u>guidance</u> on the TELPAS and TELPAS Alternate assessment.
- Teacher Certification & Educator Preparation
  - Several requirements for teacher certification have been waived adjusted. Details are posted <u>here</u>.
- Teacher and Employee Issues
  - Guidance regarding <u>educator evaluation and non-renewals</u> was updated, including guidance on student and teacher interactions while in a virtual environment.
  - Remember to seek a <u>waiver</u> if desired related to educator appraisals.
- Assessment
  - Assessment guidance is updated every few days. Please check the coronavirus website's <u>assessment section</u> for the most-up-to-date information.

- o <u>Guidance</u> related to grading and graduation requirements posted on March 30.
- FitnessGram requirements have been <u>waived</u> for this year.
- Accountability
  - An <u>Accountability FAQ</u> was posted on April 2.
    - For August 2020 accountability ratings, formal ratings for all districts will be "not-rated."
  - <u>A School Improvement FAQ</u> on changes to intervention requirements also posted on April 2.
  - Included is an initial announcement of a new grant for "Targeted Improvement" campuses to support instructional continuity (question #7 in the FAQ).
    - This Instructional Continuity Grant will be released on April 6.
- Instructional Continuity
  - Our Instructional Continuity <u>website</u> is updated daily with an FAQ, LOTS of resources, recording webinars, and much more. All optional.
  - Some updates this week included information on FERPA, early childhood, guidance on grading and graduation, and introducing a website highlighting the COVID-19 resources by <u>ESC Region</u>.
  - Thank you to the superintendents of <u>Wylie</u>, <u>Garland</u>, <u>Sinton</u>, <u>Hawkins</u>, and <u>Weimar</u> ISDs for highlighting their district's approaches to instructional continuity!
  - On next Tuesday's call, we will be doing a deep dive on optional at-home instructional resources being made available for all school systems in Texas. We previewed a first look at this resource on Wednesday's call.
- April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month
  - The <u>Guidance on Educator and Staff Issues</u> provides information regarding assessing and reporting child abuse and neglect.
- Discipline Data Deadline Extended
  - The 2019 Discipline Data Validation compliance review deadline has been <u>extended</u> past April 3. A new deadline will be announced soon.
- FEMA FAQs
  - <u>FAQs</u> on FEMA-related issues was posted, including guidance for school boards on developing policies to support reimbursement processes.
- U.S. Congress 2020 CARES Act
  - Texas is estimated to receive between 1 to 1.5 billion in funding. The exact amount is unknown at this time.
  - $\circ$  At this time, we do not know how these funds will be distributed.
