- <u>Governor Abbott's closure order</u> was extended to the end of the 2019-20 school year. Please do not send updates on districts closings to <u>disasterinfo@tea.texas.gov</u>.
- The TEA COVID-19 Superintendent Call have moved to Tuesday and Thursday at 3:00pm. The call-in information has changed. Please use the call-in information sent via TEA's Superintendent Listserv on May 5, 2020.

Recap of topics covered:

- Guidance Related to Governor Abbott's Executive Order-23 (EO-23)
 - Governor Abbott's most recent Executive Order set guidance related to <u>Summer instruction, activities, and school visits</u>.
 - As a result of EO-23, the Updated information from TEA includes guidance related to graduation and end-of-year promotion ceremonies, students accessing schools, protocols for staff accessibility were also updated.
- Graduation 2020
 - In addition to the short videos from Commissioner Morath and Lieutenant Governor Patrick, Secretary of State Hughs made a video celebrating graduating seniors. Feel free to use <u>these videos</u> with your graduation ceremonies if they will be of benefit.
- Child Nutrition
 - Since TEA cannot send information directly to families, we request that districts utilize the communications toolkit and <u>recommended communications timeline</u> posted on our <u>Child Nutrition website</u> to encourage families to take advantage of the Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer or P-EBT. communication toolkit we sent you last Thursday, we would have one more letter we will ask you to distribute to families.
 - The application for families goes live on June 1.
 - On Monday, June 1, TEA will post a *To the Administrator Addressed* letter and an email via the Superintendent Listserv containing the actual application link and the number for HHSC's customer service hotline for anyone who has questions or needs assistance applying.

- English Learner Summer School
 - A <u>new FAQ</u> was posted to provide districts information related to providing summer for school for English Learners.
 - The <u>COVID-19 Related Waivers</u> document was also updated to waive the requirement to offer bilingual education/ESL summer school to English Learners entering kindergarten and Grade 1 in Summer 2020.
- Assessment
 - o <u>Guidance</u> related to Student Assessment was updated on Thursday
 - In addition, a <u>waiver</u> was announced related to the Student Success Initiative (SSI) promotion/retention district requirement to notify parents that their child is at risk of failure.
 - If a district or charter school is not able to or does not have sufficient information to make a determination about a student's risk of failure at this time, the school district or charter should request a waiver to delay the notice requirement from the Commissioner until the start of the 20-21 school year.
- Dyslexia Screening Waiver
 - An <u>updated FAQ</u> was posted announcing a waiver related to screening and treatment of dyslexia and related disorders.
 - This waiver was also updated in the <u>COVID-19 Related Waivers</u> summary document, and includes the <u>emergency rules</u> districts must comply with.
 - The <u>Special Education FAQ</u> was also updated to include this information.
- CARES Act Funding
 - TEA announced its plan for CARES Act Funding and provided several pieces of information to support district planning:
 - A new FAQ related to the <u>CARES Act Equitable Services Provision</u>
 - An updated <u>CARES Act Funding and Expense Reimbursement FAQ</u>
 - An updated <u>Federal Funding FAQ</u>
 - An updated <u>General State Funding FAQ</u>
- School Calendar Considerations
 - New resources from East Chambers ISD were posted including their <u>original</u> <u>20-21 calendar</u> and a new <u>proposed 20-21 calendar</u> that accounts for additional time for student learning as a response to COVID-19.
- Instructional Continuity
 - A <u>new resource</u> was posted with a list of free online professional development resources and webinars for educators.
