

## State of Texas ESSER III State Plan Required Data Posting

Per the ESSER III state plan application, *Appendix A: School Operating Status and Instructional Mode Data Template* requires the following data tables be posted on the TEA website no later than June 21, 2021.

- a. **Number of schools in your State that offered each mode of instruction or learning model described in Table 1 from Appendix A.**

See table below. The data published will be based on the January 29, 2021 crisis code collection indicating the number of campuses that had either all students learning remotely, all students learning on-campus or a hybrid on that date.

- b. **Enrollment and mode of instruction for the schools in your State described in Table 2 from Appendix A.**

See table below. The data published will be based on enrollment data collected in the January 29, 2021 crisis code collection indicating the number of enrolled students by student group that attended remotely or on-campus that day.
