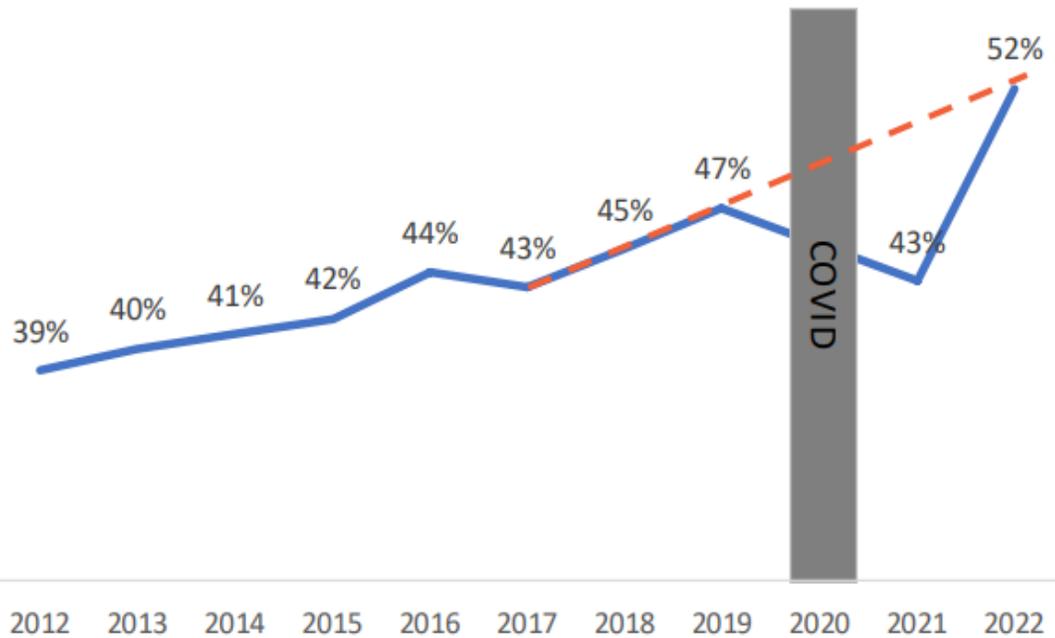

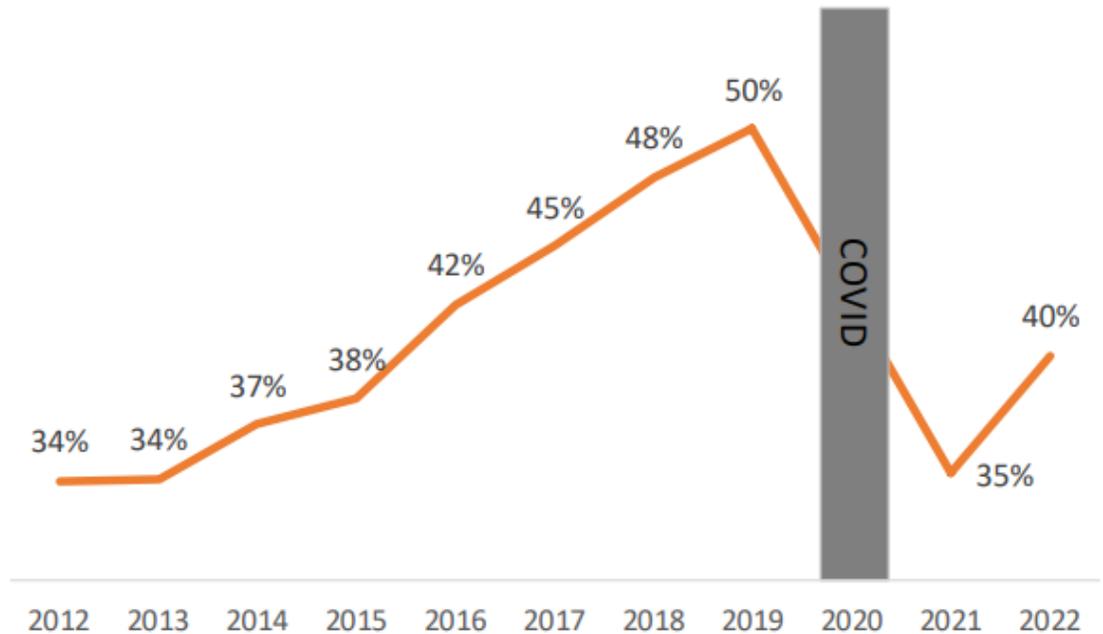

Timeline and Application Process



Key Considerations

- **Application** | opens on November 7th and closes on December 22nd at 11:59pm. The LEAs have 45 days to complete the application for the grants that they wish to apply.
- **Scoring and interview** | opens Jan. 1st- Jan. 30th. This is the window for TEA to score the applications and reach out to LEAs for interviews if the score meets the threshold. The intent of the interview is to provide a two-way opportunity to determine readiness and fit.
- **NOGA** | There is a 60-day window for NOGA issuing. The process will start on Feb. 13th and culminate on Apr. 13th. LEAs can receive their NOGA at any time between that window. Note, the NOGA can only be issued once the LEAs certifies and submits the budget in the e-grants system. Therefore, if there is a delay in LEAs submission, that may impact the NOGA date.

- We recognize that this window runs up against the winter break in some cases. Our intent here is to provide as much time and a longer runway to application completion as possible.
- Application **unique link was emailed to LEA superintendents on November 7th.**
- If the LEA is unable to receive the application link in the superintendent email, LEAs can refer to a [form](#) posted on LASO website to acquire a new link.
- A **PDF** of the application was posted on the LASO website on November 7th. However, formal submission of the application will be through the Qualtrics application survey.



Change Requests and Declines

- TCLAS was unique in the aspect of the funding source (ESSER) and the speed at which we were operating to distribute the funding.
- Therefore, to accommodate the unique circumstances of TCLAS, change requests and decline options were provided to LEAs
- Since, with LASO, we are no longer operating under the unique circumstances of TCLAS, we are going back to the traditional grant process for equity and fairness
- LASO will be anchored in the informal discretionary competitive grant process
 - Declines and change requests are not advisable in typical competitive process
 - If declines are requested, they will be considered on a case-by-case basis for the LEAs and could raise the LEA's federal grant risk level in the coming year

Technology Lending Grant (TLG) Program Description

The Technology Lending Grant program awards grant funds to school districts and open-enrollment charter schools to provide students the equipment necessary to access and use digital instructional materials at school and at home.

Necessary equipment approved as use of funds from this grant include:

- individual student devices such as laptops or tablets (including management licenses to support these products)
- individual residential internet access or area internet access such as hot spots
- insurance and care for the aforementioned devices and internet access products
- other equipment necessary to access and use electronic instructional materials such as classroom display devices

Current Equipment and Tech Plan | Applicants must provide the availability of existing equipment to students in the LEA and other funding available for the purchase of student technology devices. TEA may request the LEA's technology plan.

Performance Data | The LEA may, upon TEA request, provide any performance data necessary to assess the success of the program.

TEA Available Materials | The LEA must ensure that devices will be prioritized for classrooms and students using TEA available materials ([Texas Open Educational Resources](#)).

Training | The LEA must provide the teacher, associated instructional coach, and students with training in the proper use of the device within 90 days of installation of the device in the classroom.

General Appropriations Act, Article III, Rider 8, 87th Texas Legislature, Texas Education Code (TEC) §32.301



Technology Lending Grant (TLG) Eligibility Requirements

All school districts and open-enrollment charter schools can apply for the Technology Lending Grant.

Technology Lending Grant (TLG) Key Commitments

Application assurances and usage

- Program services and activities to be funded from this **grant will be supplementary** to existing services and activities and will not be used for any services or activities required by state law, State Board of Education rules, or local policy.
- **Adheres to all Statutory Requirements and TEA Program Requirements** as noted in the 2023-2024 Technology Lending Grant Program Guidelines.

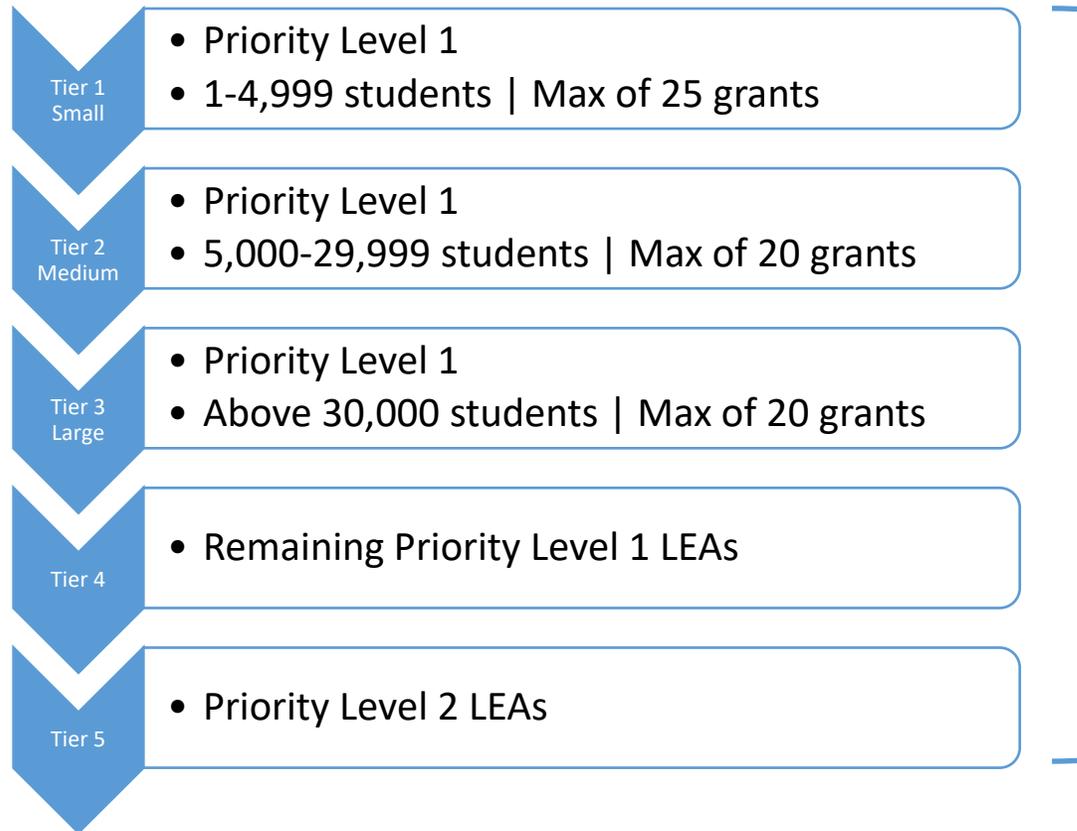


Technology Lending Grant (TLG) Key Commitments

Application assurances and usage

- The **infrastructure and technical support are adequate** to support students' use of loaned equipment provided through the grant at its participating campus(es).
- LEAs account for the technology lending equipment in accordance with district policy for accounting for such equipment, including providing insurance when insurance is typically provided for such equipment. **Grant funds cannot be used to replace lost, stolen, or damaged equipment.**
- **Devices will be prioritized** for classrooms and students using [TEA Available Materials \(OER\)](#).
- LEAs provides information (inventory logs) including a **list of students, classrooms, and schools** with access to devices or hotspots upon request by TEA.
- LEA assures that classroom-based technology will be installed in a classroom where instruction with [TEA Available Materials \(OER\)](#) will occur for at **least the full school year in which the grant is given.**
- LEA assures that the device will be used for instruction with [TEA Available Materials \(OER\)](#) for at least **51% or the majority of the time.**
- LEA assures that the **district will provide the teacher, associated instructional coach, and students with training** in the proper use of the device within 90 days of installation of the device in the classroom.

Within each tier, applicants are sorted by % economically disadvantaged students to determine prioritization.

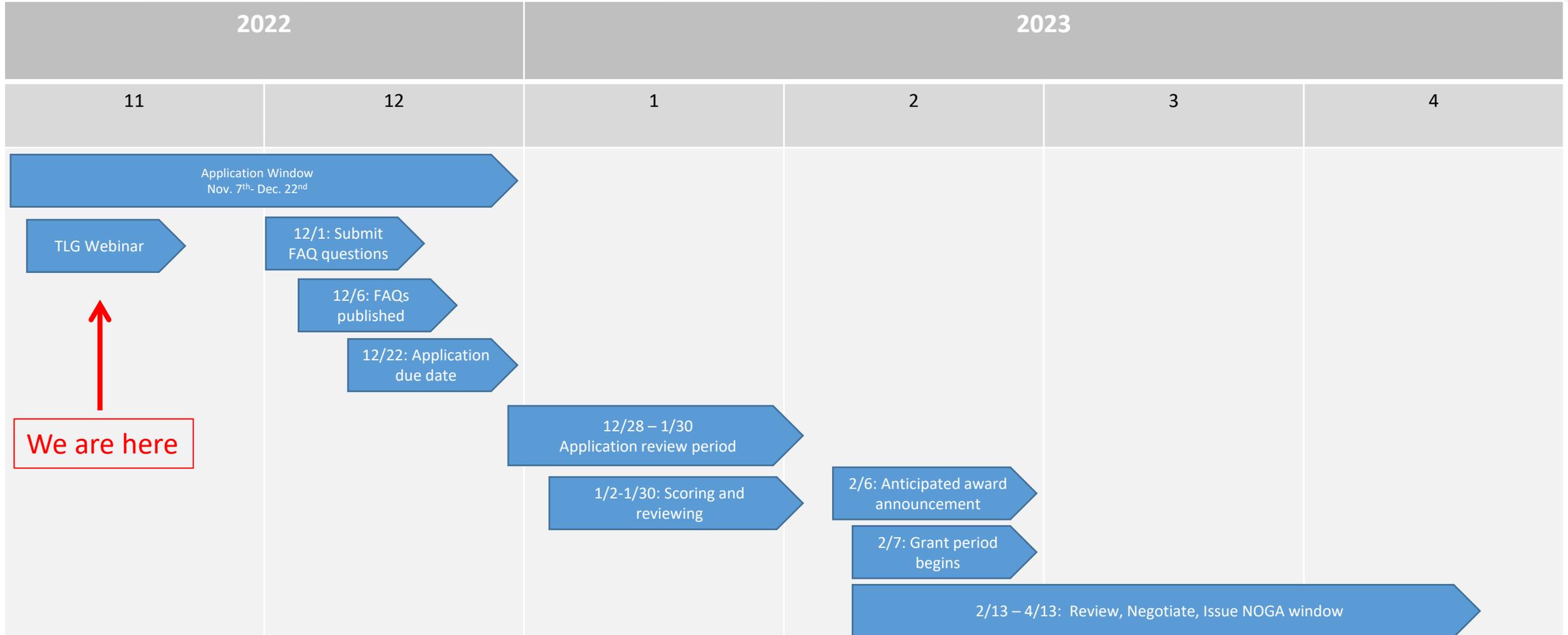
