Texas COVID Learning Acceleration Supports (TCLAS) is a set of targeted supports and <u>additional</u> state and federal funding aligned to the Learning Acceleration Framework.

LEAs will access TCLAS funding and supports through a single, streamlined discretionary, non-competitive grant application that mimics the simplicity of a formula grant.

- ➤ No narrative responses required
- ➤ No need for grant writers
- Easy budget calculations




Purpose of the TCLAS State Approved Vendor List

- The TCLAS Approved Vendor list process evaluates and approves vendors to work with districts receiving supports through TCLAS.
- Through TCLAS, participating districts may work with vendors approved for specific supports either through in-kind support from TEA or directly with grant funds awarded through the TCLAS grant application.
- Provide districts a guidance document that aligns to the design of the TCLAS application with all state approved vendor information, including:
 - Qualification criteria for all vendors in approved list
 - List of qualified vendors
 - Profiles of each qualified vendor

Previously Qualified Via TEA Process

- For some TCLAS decisions, vendors have already been approved.
- In this situation, existing vendors will be asked to complete a form that will be used to populate their vendor profile




Must Apply to Qualify for SAVL

- For decision points where vendors have not yet been qualified, TEA is running an expedited qualifications process to add vendors to the list
- Three main applications opening:
 - Decision 2a: District Implementation and Professional Learning Support
 - Decision 3a: Blended Learning Products
 - Decision 9: P-TECH Technical Assistance

TCLAS Timeline: Decision 2 HQIM Core Approved Products

| | LEAs may order all physical materials needed to implement the Tier 1 product. This includes full sets of printed materials for teachers and students, and materials necessary to support implementation (e.g., trade books, student readers, manipulatives, etc.) A full list of included inventory is available by product is included here (link coming soon). |
| 2c. Funding for Literacy and Math Coaches | LEAs may access funds to hire math and literacy coaches at elementary schools using products on the state approved list. Coaches will be required to complete the required trainings to support core Tier 1 products on the approved list. |





TCLAS Timeline: Decision 2 HQIM Core Approved Products

TEA Direct Supports (e.g., CRIMSI)

- TEA has partnered with third party vendor to provide comprehensive program for LEAs piloting materials (currently known as CRIMSI)
- LEA enters cohort with similar districts and teachers piloting same product through duration of pilot

2

Direct Grants to LEAs

- TEA awards grants directly to LEAs
- LEAs can use funds to purchase professional learning supports from vendors on state approved list

Approach and Requirements for SAVL

- TEA qualifies state approved vendors
- TEA awards districts grant funds to contract directly with approved vendors as a part of TCLAS
- In 2021-22
 - Approved vendors work directly with LEAs to contract based on need
 - Approved vendors supporting districts are required to obtain an HQIM certification to remain on the state approved vendor list (certification available spring/summer '22)
 - Certified vendors will be required to submit specific HQIM implementation data defined by TEA based on work with LEAs
- In 2022-23 and beyond
 - Certified vendors are required to support LEAs in completion of HQIM related courses that includes job-embedded supports
 - Certified vendors will be required to submit specific HQIM implementation data defined by TEA based on work with LEAs



2a. Award Calculation

TEA Direct Supports (e.g., CRIMSI)

 Districts will receive in-kind supports (TEA has already contracted directly with vendor) 2

Direct Grants to LEAs

- LEA received baseline amount to support district implementation coaching and collective learning (amount varies based on LEA size)
- LEAs receive a set amount per teacher and coach participating in pilot to receive aligned professional learning supports








TCLAS Application Components
