





A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

2	relating to improving training and staff development for primary
3	and secondary educators to enable them to more effectively serve
1	all students.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 21.044, Education Code, is amended by
7	amending Subsections (a), (b), (c-1), and (g) and adding Subsection
3	(a-1) to read as follows:
9	(a) The board shall propose rules:

- (1) specifying what each educator is expected to know and be able to do, particularly with regard to students with disabilities;
- 13 (2) establishing the training requirements a person must accomplish to obtain a certificate, enter an internship, or enter an induction-year program; and
- (3) specifying[The board shall specify] the minimum 16 academic qualifications required for a certificate.
- 18 (a-1) Any training requirements for a certificate specified under Subsection (a) must require that the person demonstrate:
- 20 (1) basic knowledge of each disability category under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (20 U.S.C. Section 1400 et seq.) and how each category can affect student learning and development;
- 24 (2) competence in the use of proactive instructional


