OVERVIEW OF THE TTU K-12 PROGRAM





OVERVIEW

- TTU K-12 was established as a "Special Purpose District" in 1993 by the Texas Legislature and the State Board of Education to serve students whose educational needs were not adequately met by traditional school districts.
- In 2020, Texas added Texas Administrative Code §61.101 identifying TTU K-12 as a special purpose school district operated by a major university.
 - The only other school that falls in this TAC chapter is UT High School.
- Since 1993,TTU K-12 has transitioned to a fully online program serving over 500,000 students from 71 countries around the world.
- Our rigorous college-ready curriculum serves Kindergarten through I 2th grade students and allows them to work ahead, make up failed credits, test out of courses, and graduate with a Texas High School Diploma.






- Focal Point: Teaching. Responsibilities include providing quality feedback, grading, holding virtual office hours, tutoring, remediation, and providing special services as needed




STUDENT SELF-IDENTIFIED RACE/ETHNICITY DATA

- Cultivate positive relationships between students and adults/peers.




STRATEGIC GOALS/PRIORITIES (CONT.)







COURSE DEVELOPMENT

- Curriculum Development
 - Authors = Subject Matter Experts. Certified Texas Teachers with curriculum development expertise
 - TTU Instructional Designers
 - Courses designed to required state curriculum standards: Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS)
 - TEKS are revised cyclically, and courses must be redeveloped with all TEKS revisions.

- Ongoing Support
 - Regular course revision and improvement
 - Professional development for teachers
 - LMS/SIS
 - Course content and structure
 - Online Pedagogy
 - Cybersecurity

PEDAGOGY

BEST PRACTICES FOR ONLINE LEARNING

Provide explicit instructions on all course content.

LET STUDENTS KNOW:

- How to complete activities
- How to navigate the course
- When and how to interact with other students
- What teachers expect
- When and how to submit assignments
- When to expect a response from a teacher

FAMILY VOICES

- "We get to make our own schedule, which is fantastic. That's what I love about TTU K-12. We haven't missed out on anything, and we can get all of our coursework done." Mom of a current TTU K-12 5th Grader and 2nd Grader.
