GYO aims to address teacher shortages in hard-to-staff areas, close demographic gaps between students and teachers, and build interest in the teaching profession among high school students

Pathway 1: High school education and training courses

- Spark interest in coursework through the leadership of exemplar teachers; and
- Develop knowledge and skills of teaching through rigorous coursework; and

- Connect students to the field through partnerships with Career and Technical Student Organizations; and
- Promote dual credit Education and Training coursework. •

Pathway 2: Transition of candidates—paraprofessionals, educational aides, and longterm substitutes— into full-time certified teaching positions

- Provide candidates with the release time and financial support to complete a bachelor's degree and/or teacher certification; and
- Increase the entry of diverse individuals into the teaching profession; and •
- Promote long-term recruitment and retention of dedicated staff who desire opportunities for advancement.

In 2021–2023, GYO participation numbers were impacted when Teacher Residencies became a separate initiative.



Increased Demand

Through the Texas COVID Learning Acceleration Supports (TCLAS) grant, participating districts grew from 9 in Cycle 4 to 384 in Cycle 5 (a 4,000% + increase)

More than 800 teachers, administrators, and counselors attended the 2021 GYO Summer Institute.

High-quality Resources

The newly developed Education and Training curriculum provides high-quality teacher preparation materials at no cost to districts.

Program Expansion

Originally developed to address teacher shortages in small and rural districts, GYO now supports districts in all 20 educational regions.
