

College Admissions Testing of Graduating Seniors in Texas and the United States, Class of 2012

This report presents SAT and ACT examination participation and performance data for graduating seniors in Texas and the United States in public and nonpublic schools combined. College admissions examination results are used by colleges and universities to make admissions decisions, to place students in appropriate freshman courses, and to award scholarships to students. In Texas, moreover, public school results are used in determining eligibility for student exemptions from Texas Success Initiative assessment requirements and to acknowledge districts and campuses through the public school accountability system for high levels of performance.

Results presented in this report were obtained, when available, from summary reports released annually by the College Board and by ACT, Inc., respectively, to the Texas Education Agency (TEA). The results are based only on the most recent examinations taken by students identified by the College Board and ACT, Inc., as expecting to graduate in the reporting year. SAT and ACT Participation in Texas and the United States

- In Texas, 172,802 public and nonpublic high school graduates in the class of 2012 took the SAT, and 110,180 took the ACT (Tables 1 and 2). Nationally, 1,664,479 graduates took the SAT, and 1,666,017 took the ACT.
- SAT examinees in Texas made up 10.4 percent of all examinees in the United States. ACT examinees in Texas made up 6.6 percent of all ACT examinees in the United States.
- In Texas, 62 percent of public and nonpublic high school graduates in the class of 2012 took the SAT, and 39 percent took the ACT. Across the United States, 52 percent of graduates took the SAT, and 52 percent took the ACT.
- SAT participation rates increased from those for the previous class by 4 percentage points in Texas, and by 2 percentage points in the United States. ACT participation rates increased by 3 percentage points in both Texas and the United States.

SAT and ACT Performance in Texas and the United States

- The average SAT critical reading and mathematics combined score for Texas public and nonpublic high school examinees in the class of 2012 was 973, down 8 points from the average for the class of 2011 (Table 3). Nationally, the average SAT critical reading and mathematics combined score for the class of 2012 was 1010, down 1 point from the average for the class of 2011. The average critical reading, mathematics, and writing scores were lower in Texas than the nation.
- The average ACT composite score for Texas public and nonpublic high school examinees in the class of 2012 was 20.8, the same as the average for the class of 2011 (Table 4 on page 9). Nationally, the average composite score for the class of 2012 was 21.1, the same as the average for the class of 2011. The average ACT mathematics score for all examinees in the class of 2012 was higher in Texas than the nation, and the average English, reading, and science scores were lower in Texas than the nation.

SAT and ACT Examinee Populations in Texas and the United States

- In Texas, 39.7 percent of SAT examinees in the class of 2012 were White, 35.6 percent were Hispanic, and 14.1 percent were African American (Table 5). Across the United States, by comparison, 51.2 percent were White, 16.4 percent were Hispanic, and 13.1 percent were African American.
- In Texas, 40.4 percent of ACT examinees in the class of 2012 were White, 37.1 percent were Hispanic, and 12.1 percent were African American (Table 6 on page 14). Across the United States, by comparison, 59.0 percent were White, 14.1 percent were Hispanic, and 13.3 percent were African American.
- In Texas, 53.5 percent of SAT examinees in the class of 2012 were female, and 46.5 percent were male (Table 7 on page 14). Across the United States, 53.3 percent of examinees were female, and 46.7 percent were male.
- In Texas, 54.7 percent of ACT examinees in the class of 2012 were female, and 45.3 percent were male (Table 8 on page 15). Across the United States, 54.1 percent of examinees were female, and 45.7 percent were male.

SAT and ACT Participation and Performance by State

• SAT and ACT participation rates varied considerably across states (Table 9 on facing page and Table 10 on page 19). Rates of SAT participation ranged from 3 percent to 100 percent, and rates of ACT participation ranged from 9 percent to 100 percent. In Texas, the SAT participation rate was 62 percent, and the ACT participation rate was 39 percent.
