

College Admissions Testing Results for Graduating Seniors in Texas and the United States, Class of 2018

This report presents SAT and ACT examination participation and performance data for graduating seniors in Texas and the United States in public and nonpublic schools combined. College admissions examination results are used by colleges and universities to make admissions decisions, to place students in appropriate freshman courses, and to award scholarships to students. In Texas, moreover, results for public school students are used in the public school accountability system in evaluating the performance of districts and campuses in the assignment of rating labels and in awarding distinction designations to acknowledge districts and campuses for high levels of performance. In addition, results are used in determining eligibility for student exemptions from Texas Success Initiative assessment requirements and in substituting for certain end-ofcourse assessments to meet graduation requirements.

Results presented in this report were obtained, when available, from summary reports released annually by the College Board and by ACT, Inc., to the Texas Education Agency (TEA). The results are based only on the most recent examinations taken by students identified by the College Board and ACT, Inc.,

as expecting to graduate in the reporting year. In March 2016, the College Board began administering a redesigned version of the SAT. Results reported by the College Board and presented in this report for class of 2016 graduates include only students who took the previous version of the SAT. In Texas, only a small percentage of class of 2016 graduating seniors took the redesigned SAT. Beginning with class of 2017 graduates, results reported by the College Board and presented in this report include only students who took the redesigned SAT. The majority of graduates in Texas since the class of 2017 have taken the redesigned SAT.

SAT and ACT Participation in Texas and the United States

- In Texas, 226,374 public and nonpublic high school graduates in the class of 2018 took the SAT, and 141,253 took the ACT (Tables 1 and 2). Nationally, 2,136,539 graduates took the SAT, and 1,914,817 took the ACT.
- SAT examinees in Texas made up 10.6 percent of all examinees in the United States. ACT examinees in Texas made up 7.4 percent of all ACT examinees in the United States.
- In Texas, 66 percent of public and nonpublic high school graduates in the class of 2018 took the SAT, and 41 percent took the ACT. Across the United States, 62 percent of graduates took the SAT, and 55 percent took the ACT.
- Between the classes of 2017 and 2018, SAT participation rates increased by 4 percentage points in Texas and 11 percentage points in the United States. ACT participation rates decreased by 4 percentage points in Texas and 5 percentage points in the United States.

SAT and ACT Performance in Texas and the United States

- The average SAT total score for Texas public and nonpublic high school examinees in the class of 2018 was 1032, up 12 points from the average for the class of 2017 (Table 3). Nationally, the average SAT total score for the class of 2018 was 1068, up 8 points from the average for the class of 2017. The average evidence-based reading and writing and mathematics scores for all examinees in the class of 2018 were lower in Texas than the nation.
- The average ACT composite score for Texas public and nonpublic high school examinees in the class of 2018 was 20.6, down 0.1 points from the average for the class of 2017 (Table 4 on page 6). Nationally, the average composite score for the class of 2018 was 20.8, down 0.2 points from the average for the class of 2017. The average ACT mathematics and science scores for all examinees in the class of 2018 were higher in Texas than the nation, and the average English and reading scores were lower in Texas than the nation.

SAT and ACT Examinee Populations in Texas and the United States

- In Texas, 45.0 percent of SAT examinees in the class of 2018 were Hispanic, 30.5 percent were White, and 12.3 percent were African American (Table 5). Across the United States, by comparison, 23.4 percent were Hispanic, 43.6 percent were White, and 12.3 percent were African American.
- In Texas, 39.0 percent of ACT examinees in the class of 2018 were Hispanic, 33.9 percent were White, and 10.3 percent were African American (Table 6 on page 11). Across the United States, by comparison, 16.1 percent were Hispanic, 52.1 percent were White, and 12.7 percent were African American.
- In Texas, 52.9 percent of SAT examinees in the class of 2018 were female, and 47.1 percent were male (Table 7 on page 11). Across the United States, 52.3 percent of examinees were female, and 47.7 percent were male.
- In Texas, 54.0 percent of ACT examinees in the class of 2018 were female, and 45.5 percent were male (Table 8 on page 12). Across the United States, 51.8 percent of examinees were female, and 46.7 percent were male.

SAT and ACT Participation and Performance by State

• SAT and ACT participation rates varied considerably across states (Table 9 on page 14 and Table 10 on page 16). For the class of 2018, rates of SAT participation ranged from 2 percent to 100 percent, and rates of ACT participation ranged from 7 percent to 100 percent. In Texas, the SAT participation rate was 66 percent, and the ACT participation rate was 41 percent.
