SPP Indicator 12: Early Childhood Transition Data Integrity Checklist



Data Integrity Checklist

Local education agencies (LEAs) must provide valid and reliable data for the measurement of State Performance Plan Indicator 12 (SPPI 12). This requirement is a factor in the annual LEA determination processes and in the annual federal determination process for the State of Texas.

When the LEA certifies data in the SPPI 12 Texas Education Agency Login (TEAL) application, the LEA is assuring the Texas Education Agency (TEA) they "understand and agree that submission of this information constitutes certification that this data are accurate and meets the reporting requirements outlined by TEA's Division of Special Education Program Reporting."

Data Integrity Checklist

Use this checklist prior to data certification:

- Did you read and follow the data collection requirements for SPPI 12 outlined in the instructions?
- Did you read the SPPI 12 guidance documents found on the <u>SPPI 12: Early Childhood Transition</u> website?
- Did you review the previous year's SPPI 12 data submission to determine whether or not the current year's data submission is consistent? If not, do you have an explanation for why the data are inconsistent with the previous year?

Example: In 2019-20, LEA A reported that 4 students were referred from Part C to B. In 2020-21, LEA A reported that 25 students were referred from Part C to B. The difference between the two years was 21 students. Were those 25 students enrolled the previous year? Was there an influx of enrolled students? Can you justify why there was an increase (or decrease) in district wide special education applicable to SPPI 12? This type of data analysis and critical examination of the reported SPPI 12 data provides an opportunity to check if the LEA has over (or under) reported data and to make systemic changes as a result.

- If reporting SPPI 12 noncompliance, did you identify the root cause(s) contributing to the noncompliance?
 - o Have you responded to the issue(s) that caused SPPI 12 noncompliance?
 - Did the LEA revise its policies and procedures and/or operating guidelines to address noncompliance?
 - o Did the LEA train personnel in the identified area(s) of noncompliance?
 - Did the LEA implement a system of self-monitoring to prevent noncompliance from occurring in the future?

Technical Assistance
