

What Families Should Know About the Texas Through-year Assessment Pilot (TTAP)

- ✓ **TTAP is an exploratory assessment program developed by the Texas Education Agency (TEA) that is being tested as a potential replacement for the State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR®).**

TTAP consists of three shorter tests given throughout the school year. This gives your student multiple chances to demonstrate what he/she knows and can do. Teachers use test results in conjunction with classroom performance to influence their instruction going forward.



- ✓ **Districts administer TTAP during one-week windows in the fall, winter, and spring.**

Opportunity 1 – November 11-15, 2024

Opportunity 2 – January 27-31, 2025

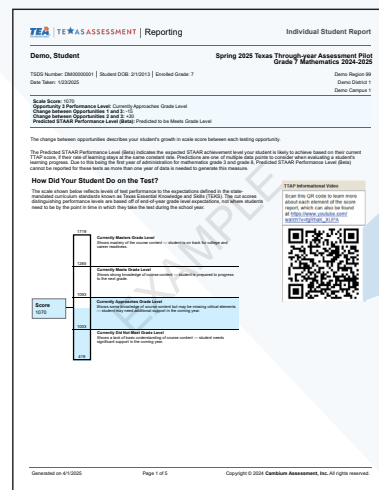
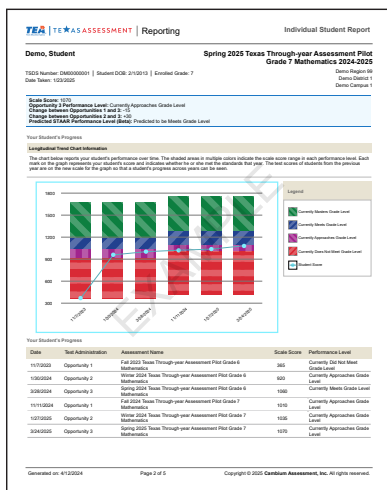
Opportunity 3 – March 24-28, 2025

TTAP eliminates the need for additional benchmarking assessments used in the classroom that can take away from instructional time.

- ✓ **TTAP assessments are not assigned a classroom grade.**

Reports are available after each testing window to measure growth.

Districts are responsible for sharing TTAP results with families throughout the year.
