



Background & Cycle Distinction



Federal Dollars to Support Schools


In 2021, the <u>U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS)</u> invested \$10 billion from the American Rescue Plan to states to enable schools to establish COVID-19 screening testing programs to support and maintain in-person learning by slowing the spread of COVID-19.

ELC Reopening Schools: Support For Screening Testing Reopen & Keep Schools Operating Safely Grant*

Texas received a total ~\$803 million, and the dollars flow through the state health department to administer- the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS).

• Within the \$803 million, ~**\$221 million in grant funding was allocated for eligible public & private school systems** available for them to apply for funding and use for several allowable expenses, including additional services/resources (i.e. PPE, HEPA filters, cover CLIA waivers, etc.)

DSHS and TEA have partnered together to make these resources available to public and private K-12 systems in Texas.



Grant Breakdown

K-12 COVID-19 Testing
Program

Provide school-based COVID-19 testing activities through the work of six approved vendors which provide eligible public and private school systems with access to COVID-19 tests (rapid antigen & PCR) & staffing support to assist in administering tests.

School Health Support

Grant

Provide eligible K-12 public and private school systems with access to needed funds **to further** support COVID mitigation/prevention resources and activities.

Overview: Grant Cycles Explained


TEA has been asked to implement enhanced monitoring & reporting for the duration of this grant program, which necessitates changes to previous grant processes and applications to ensure grant compliance.

The term "Cycle 3" might be a bit confusing; it does not indicate a new funding; it's an <u>extension of the School Health</u> <u>Support Grant from SY21-22</u> for specific LEAs in that cycle.*

- Cycle 1- LEAs that applied, received a NOGA, and were fully paid during SY21-22.
- > Cycle 2- LEAs & private schools that applied, received a NOGA, but were **not paid during SY21-22.**
 - ➤ This cycle also includes private schools that did not previously apply but might choose to apply during SY22-23.*
- > Cycle 3- LEA's that never applied during SY21-22 and now can apply through eGrants.
 - The entitlements/allocation list

There is no new or increased funding for this grant; entitlements/allocation amounts have NOT changed at this time!

Cycle 1 Process

Cycle 1- School systems that applied received a NOGA and were fully paid during SY21-22 for the School Health Support Grant.

Next steps:

- ➤ LEAs that did not expend all of their grant funds will have an opportunity to expend their remaining funds throughout the duration of this grant, including a new allowable activity, wraparound services.
- LEAs that have expended all of their grant funds can reclassify expenditures or amend their grant through this amendment link.
- > LEAs will continue in the Qualtrics application system from SY2021-2022.
- Additional grant guidance will be provided by or before Monday, September 26.


Cycle 2 Process

Cycle 2- LEAs & private schools that applied, received a NOGA, but were not paid during SY21-22.* This also includes private schools that did not previously apply but might choose to apply during SY22-23.*

Next steps:

- > LEAs & private schools will apply through the PDF grant application process.
- > The PDF grant application will be posted on the TEA Grant Opportunities page.


Cycle 3 Process

Cycle 3- LEA's that **never applied** during SY21-22 and now can apply through eGrants.

> The entitlements/allocation list only includes the school systems that never applied.

Notice for Schools in the City of Houston



- The City of Houston received over <u>~\$69M from the federal</u> government as part of this grant to support public and private school systems within the city boundaries.
- If you are a <u>public or private school system within the City of</u>

 <u>Houston city limits</u>, you are NOT eligible to be part of the state's testing program.
- Please contact <u>the Houston Health Department</u> for information regarding their testing program.

Funding & Allocations



Funding & Allocations

- LEAs: The School Health Support Grant was calculated with a per-pupil formula at \$38.57 per student based on 2020 PEIMS data.*
- Private schools: Allocations cannot be determined at this time as TEA does not have comprehensive enrollment data for all private schools. Private school allocations will be added to the eligibility list after application submission and calculation of allocation by TEA. For planning purposes, a private school may estimate their allocation at \$38.57 per student aged 3-21.
- School Health Support Grant- Cycle 2 school systems can find their allocations on the <u>official grant entitlements page.</u>







For Private Schools Only



• If a private school system applies and accepts these grant funds, they will become a recipient of federal assistance, making them subject to specific federal requirements.

Allowable & Unallowable Activities

- 1. PPE (including but not limited to masks, gloves, gowns, & face shields)
- 2. Hygiene and cleaning supplies
- 3. Portable high-efficiency particulate air (HEPA) fan/filtration systems or other small items that may allow for improved air circulation
- 4. Public health events that include students and other community members and are aimed at providing opportunities for increased detection and prevention of COVID-19
- 5. Testing events that may also involve other mitigation activities (e.g., promotion of vaccination) to limit the spread of COVID-19
- 6. Costs to obtain a CLIA waiver
- 7. Partial funding for staff conducting additional grant-related duties that are outside of the staff's normal activities, including screening testing, COVID prevention programs, or grant reporting
- 8. Wrap-around (e.g., food, laundry, mental health services, etc.) services for those who test positive





Unallowable Activities Overview-Part 1 of 2

Unallowable activities and use of funds for this grant may include <u>but are not limited to</u> the following:



- Debt service (lease-purchase)
- Advisory Council
- Major renovations or construction
- Tuition reimbursement
- Out-of-State Travel
- COVID-19 testing-test kits, turn-key testing services, and related support services
- HVAC Systems
- Cleaning Equipment or Contracted Cleaning Services from non-employees or providers
- Purchasing technology to support campus testing (i.e., iPads, iPhones, and/or other devices)
- Water filtration systems-supplies and equipment

Unallowable Activities Overview- Part 2 of 2

Unallowable activities and use of funds for this grant may include <u>but are not limited</u> to the following:



- Health supplies used in events (i.e., band-aids and/or general medical-related supplies)
- Cost of Membership in Any Civic or Community Organization
- Hosting or Sponsoring of Conferences
- Travel Costs for Officials such as Executive Director, Superintendent, or Board Members
- Lobbying or any activity that appears to be lobbying
- Stipends for non-employees
- Field Trips
- Travel for students to conferences
- Non-employee costs for conferences



Additional Details

• **Pre-award** is available back to May 1, 2021

• Grant End Day: March 31, 2023

• Application Due Date: Friday, November 18, 2022

• Last Amendment Due Date: Tuesday, January 3, 2023

• **Fund Type:** Federal

Direct Administrative Costs:

• TEA permits applicants to budget reasonable and necessary direct administrative costs for this grant program.

No more than 5% of the total grant award.

Indirect Administrative Costs:

• LEAs: Equal to the LEAs current approved restricted indirect cost rate for this federally funded grant.

• **Private Schools:** Private schools may claim a maximum of 8% indirect costs as authorized by 34 CFR 76.564(c)(2).



Reporting & Compliance Monitoring




Reporting Requirements

Recipients of the School Health Support Grant funds will be required to submit:

Monthly reports addressing grant activities, progress on milestones, and fiscal or financial/expenditure data	 Via Smart Sheets. The link and instructions are sent out every month by the 15th, and school systems have approximately two weeks to complete the report. If the deadline is missed, school systems will need to submit the information on the following monthly expenditure report.
Annual progress reports (APRs) or final reports	May later be required by TEA.
As a result of federal enhanced monitoring and reporting	 School systems that are recipients of the School Health Support Grant are required to thoroughly track all expenditures and keep a record of other applicable documents. The documents must be readily available upon request.
