#### E-rate Funding

- Coming Soon: The Texas Education Agency (TEA) will soon launch the application portal for the State Match Program. Please stay tuned for updates and announcements regarding the program's activation and submission timelines.
  - The Texas Education Agency (TEA) is offering a State Match Fund to support eligible school systems in maximizing their federal E-rate Category One funding. This initiative helps bridge the remaining cost gap for high-poverty districts seeking broadband infrastructure improvements.

#### Additional Days School Year (ADSY) Update and Expansion

- The Additional Days School Year (ADSY) initiative provides formula funding to school systems adding up to 30 additional instructional days (beyond a minimum of 175 days) at eligible campuses. House Bill 2 introduces three key updates to the ADSY program, as described in the correspondence above:
  - Base Calendar Eligibility Requirement Lowered to 175 Instructional Days
  - Grade Eligibility Expanded to PK-8
  - New Pathway to ¾-Day Formula Funding for Campuses Offering 200+ Days
