## Resource Campus Designation



## What is the Resource Campus designation?

The Resource Campus designation is a school turnaround model established by House Bill 1525 during the 87<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislative Session and updated in the 89<sup>th</sup>. The designation provides targeted state funding and support to campuses with a history of unacceptable performance ratings. These supports are designed to complement existing systems and initiatives, including Accelerated Campus Excellence (ACE) plans, high-quality staffing structures, student and staff support services, high-quality instructional materials, and evidence-based instructional practices.

Eligible campuses may also generate additional district revenue, helping to sustain these innovative practices over time.

## What are the benefits?

Campuses receive sustainable and renewable funding through:

- Continuing support and funding through initiatives such as the Teacher Incentive Allotment (TIA), High Quality Instructional Materials (HQIM), and Additional Days School Year (ADSY);
- Staffing plans that empower school leaders and utilize experienced and proven teachers for student success;
- Tutoring and extended services to best meet the needs of students; and
- Additional district revenue to help sustain these innovative practices over time

## What are the requirements?

- At least three overall performance ratings of D, F, or NR/NR1365 in the past last 10 years;
- Teacher Incentive Allotment (TIA) implementation with at least 50% of foundation curriculum teachers designated;
- Accelerated Campus Excellence (ACE) turnaround plan implementation;
- ADSY (if elementary of middle school) implementation;
- HQIM implementation;
- Foundation curriculum teachers must have two years' experience;
- One counselor for every 300 students and one appropriately licensed mental health professional;
- Positive Behavior Plan; and
- Family Engagement Plan
