School Health Survey 2023-2024

The Texas Education Code (TEC), §38.0141, requires the Texas Education Agency (TEA) to collect data relating to student health and physical activity from each school district/charter district. The School Health Survey has been developed for this purpose. The data gathered will allow the agency to better address the various health-related needs of Texas schools and students statewide.

The survey will take approximately 15-30 minutes to complete. This survey must be completed **ONLINE** and can be submitted only <u>once</u> for each school district (including a district designated as a district of innovation) and open-enrollment charter school. Responses should reflect the entire 2023-2024 academic year and may require input from different staff members within the district/charter school to completely answer the survey questions.

Please coordinate with staff to ensure there is <u>one</u> submission per school district/openenrollment charter and continue the survey on the same device and location (IP address). Should a school district or open-enrollment charter submit the survey more than once, the most recent submission, even if incomplete, will be considered the final submission.
