

# Physical Education Report (TEC §38.0141)

2023 – 2024 Physical Education Report Summary



### **Physical Education**

<u>Texas Education Code (TEC) §38.0141</u> requires the commissioner of education to complete a report on physical education provided by each school district and publish the report on the TEA website. The report must include the following:


- (1) The number of physical education classes offered at each campus in the district and the number of days, classes, and minutes offered each week by each campus;
- (2) The ratio of students enrolled in physical education classes compared to overall district enrollment;
- (3) The average physical education class size at each campus in the district;
- (4) The number of physical education teachers in the district who are licensed, certified, or endorsed by an accredited teacher preparation program to teach physical education;
- (5) Whether each campus in the district has the appropriate equipment and adequate facilities for students to engage in the amount and intensity of physical activity required by state law;
- (6) Whether the district allows modifications or accommodations to meet the needs of students with disabilities; and
- (7) Whether the district has a policy that allows teachers or administrators in the district to withhold physical activity from a student as punishment.

The number of the question appears in the upper right corner of the slide that answers this requirement.

#### Schools offering the highest number of P.E. CLASSES per week



The top 10 campuses per campus type with the highest average number of P.E. classes offered per week




#### Average number DAYS per week that P.E. is offered








The top 10 campuses per type with the highest average weekly number of P.E. minutes offered per week




### Percent of teachers licensed, certified, or endorsed to teach P.E.


# Percent of teachers licensed, certified, or endorsed by an accredited teacher preparation program to teach P.E.



62.28% of 26,367 P.E. teachers have standard certifications.

This percentage does not include teachers with generalist certifications who would also be certified to teach P. E. However, it does include teachers with standard, provisional, probationary, probationary extension, one-year, emergency, internship, non-renewable, and professional certificates. Multiple certifications held by an educator are counted separately.




### **TEM** Modifications or Accommodations

# **TEM** Withholding Physical Activity




95% of LEAs report that they do not have a policy to withhold physical activity as
