






Learning Acceleration Support Opportunities (LASO)



Learning Acceleration Support Opportunities (LASO) is a **single, consolidated application that combines grants, allotments, and in-kind supports,** bundled around a few key strategies to accelerate academic gains. LASO Cycle 4 will offer 15 opportunities focused on curriculum & instruction, educator training, more time, and innovative school models.



LASO Cycle 4 will be anchored in four Learning Acceleration Strategies






Initiative Selection Tool

School System Friendly Application Timeline

The 60-day October 3—December 3 application window

- aligns with school system planning cycles
- avoids major breaks and testing windows
- supports timely strategic decision-making.

Prioritization Criteria

Prioritization criteria broadly designed for LASO grants, where applicable, to support strategic and timely awarding.

- Academic BOM or districts with 5 + years of UA rating
- 165 or more instructional days*




Timeline Overview- LASO 4 application opens October 3 and closes December 3, 5:00 pm CST





Notable Dates

- Application Window: Oct 3 Dec 3 (60 days to apply for selected initiatives).
- Scoring & Interviews: Dec 4– Jan 22 (TEA may conduct interviews to assess readiness and fit).
- eGrants Award Acceptance Window: Feb 3 Mar 5 (school systems accept or decline potential awards).
- NOGA Issuance: Processed within 60 days in order of receipt.
 - NOGAs are issued in the order that eGrants application acceptances are submitted by the school systems. Delays in submitting acceptance may result in delayed NOGA issuance.




State-Approved Provider List (SAPL)










Process Improvement

- Flexible Navigation
 - You can move back and forth in the application to review and revise before submitting.
- Important Reminder
 - Once you select your ESC region and School System (and choose a campus for applicable programs), these choices cannot be changed.

To revise, you must request a retake link.





Submission Requirement

- Superintendent's Signature Required
 - The application must be officially signed by the superintendent.
- If Unable to Sign Due to Extenuating Circumstances
 - Email <u>LASO@tea.texas.gov</u> for assistance.



School systems must submit LASO Cycle 4 applications by **December 3 at 5:00pm CST**





TEA will email unique application links to school system superintendents on October 3 (if needed, school systems can complete a Request for Application Link Form (will be available on the LASO 4 website on October 3rd).



PDF of the application will be posted on the <u>LASO Cycle 4 website</u>; however, school systems must submit the application through Qualtrics using the unique application link.



Applications must be signed by the superintendent to be accepted.

Change Requests and Declines in LASO



- LASO is an informal discretionary competitive grant process
 - Declines and change requests are not advisable in typical competitive process
 - If declines are requested, they will be considered on a case-by-case basis for the school systems and could raise the school system's federal grant risk level in the coming year
